She is a member of Troop 365 and a student at Meyzeek Middle School. It took a very large cart and several smaller ones to bring all of the donated items into the building.

A women's Bible Study Group from Middletown United Methodist Church brought a large group of enthusiastic women to volunteer one fall morning. Several of the volunteers are past PTA officers at the local and district levels and have kept us on their volunteer radar even now that they are no longer involved in PTA.

The Galilee Baptist Church sent two groups of hard-working ladies on two separate days late last year, and it has three

Saturdays scheduled for June. During one workday, they assembled more than 2,000 belts.

Theresa Mayfield works every Tuesday with the students from Binet School, doing laundry and making sure the Family Room is ready for clients.

Myrdin Thompson works on Thursdays to let in another group of students from Binet School and Churchill Park School to volunteer.

Students from Binet and Churchill Park are at CAP on a weekly basis to size and hang clothes; sort hangers; fold shirts, socks, and underwear; and do whatever else needs to be done that day. Both groups have been working with CAP since it was at the McFerran location.

Deborah Howard, a new volunteer, comes faithfully every Tuesday and Thursday to sort clothing. She is visually impaired but does not let that stop her, and we are very grateful that she found us.

On Wednesdays, Kathy Courtney volunteers even though she lives in Oldham County and her children attend North Oldham Schools. The fact that she's my sister does have something to do with her choice of volunteer locations. We have lots of fun and invite other sisters to join us.
